

THE FORD METER BOX HEALTH CLUB

On April 26, 1980, Ford Meter Box held a dedication ceremony for the company's new gymnasium. Dedicated in memory of Stan Ford, this space was the start of Ford's health club and confirmed the company's commitment to promoting health and fitness.

Stan was an excellent athlete who enjoyed sports and stayed fit. He envisioned a space in the factory that would be a focus for promoting wellness, physical strength, flexibility, and fitness.

Stan's vision continues today and on July 16, 2010 a new and expanded health club was opened in his name. A bit different from the original gymnasium which has since given way to manufacturing use, today's space features flat panel TVs with wireless sound, a walking track, locker rooms, a sauna, strength and aerobic training equipment along with a large activity room.

Most of the exercise equipment was purchased by the Employees' Association. This group understands the benefits of good health, and they earmark much of their income (the profits from factory vending machines) for the purchase and maintenance of the Health Club's equipment.

Industrial onsite facilities offer such advantages as 24hour availability for second and third shift and programs aimed at employee rehabilitation. Ford's program also provides lunch-hour walking opportunities and educational seminars.
